1870

Don Maximiano conceived the magnificent wine cellar, which allowed for storing a total of 6 MM liters.



1873

Viña Errázuriz launched its first wine. The winery had 300 ha and plant cuttings imported from France.



1914

Alfonso Chadwick Errázuriz was born, representing the fourth generation of the Errázuriz family in Chile.



1983

Eduardo Chadwick joined his father Alfonso at Viña Errázuriz. He recognized Chile's great potential for producing premium wines.

Berlin Tasting: a blind tasting including Viña Errázuriz icon wines along with world-class wines where Errázuriz stand with the same high quality.





2010

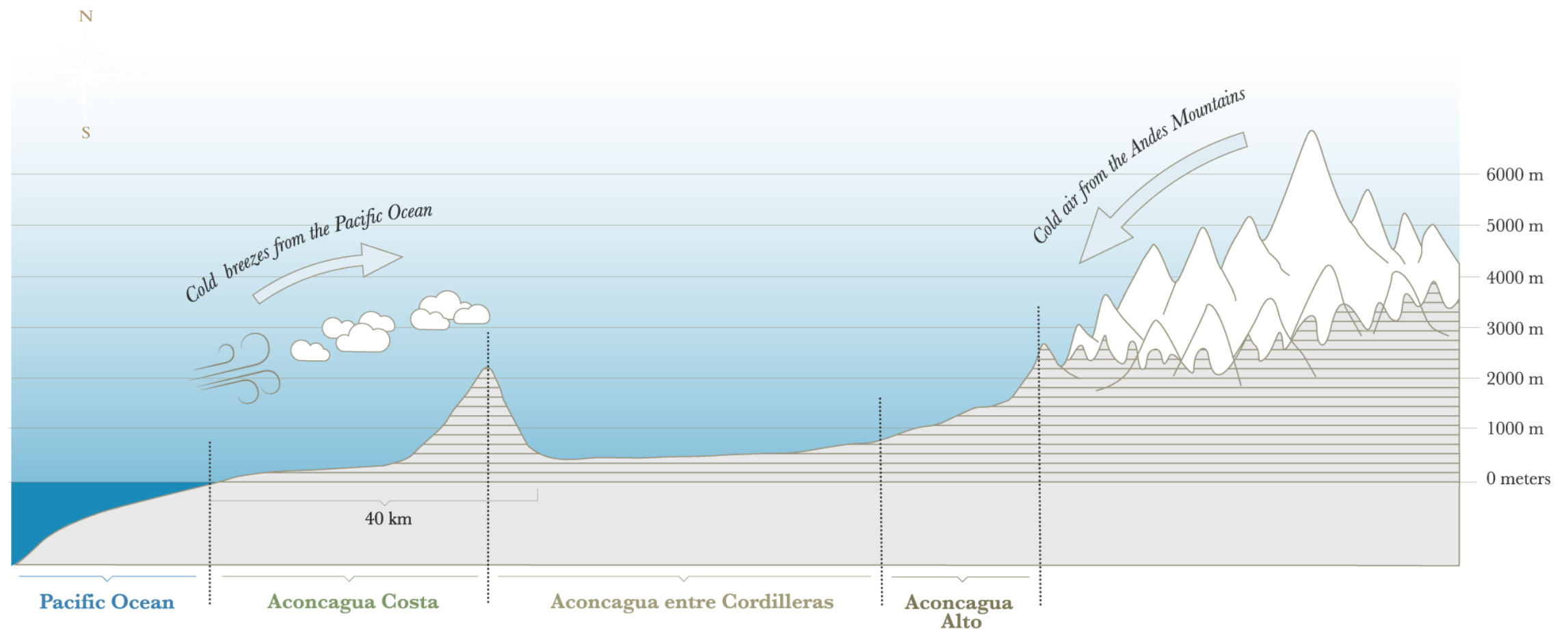
Viña Errázuriz inaugurated the **Don Maximiano Icon Winery**, dedicated solely to the production of premium wines.

ACONCAGUA VALLEY - GEOGRAPHY

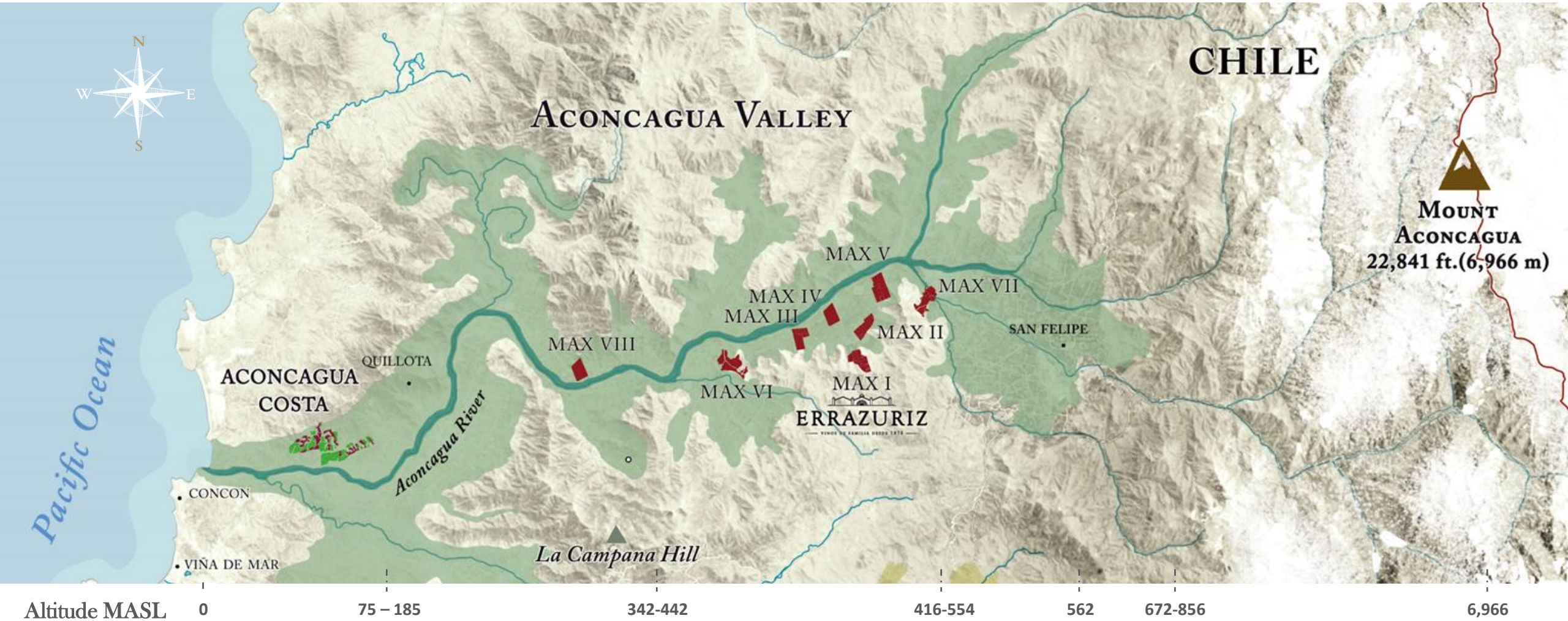


ACONCAGUA VALLEY - CLIMATE

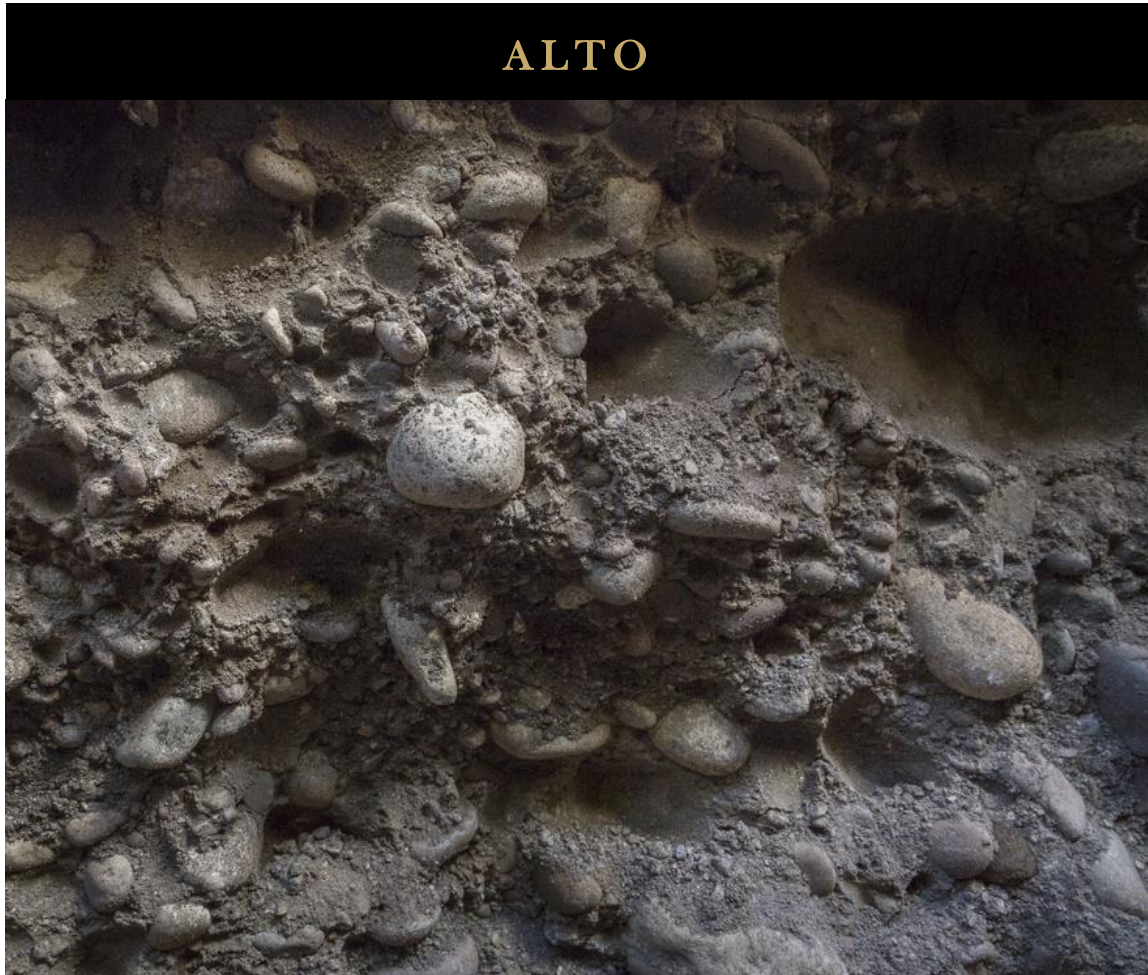

ACONCAGUA ALTO - SOILS PROFILE

ALTO



- Alluvial soils: high content of rounded rocks or “*galet roulé*”.
- Terraces of rocks that were formed through millions of years with the Aconcagua river (“riverbed” or river terrace).
- Great drainage, deep soils, ideals to produce Bordeaux varieties.

ACONCAGUA ENTRE CORDILLERAS - SOILS PROFILE

ENTRE CORDILLERAS



- Colluvial soils, with a high content of volcanic rocks.
- The colluvial soils have stones with angular shape, which come from the detachment of the slopes.
- Low fertility. It helps to control the vigor of the plants (smaller grapes and more concentrated flavors).
- Better sun exposure for being on the slopes, allowing a better maturity and health in the grapes.

ACONCAGUA COSTA - SOILS PROFILE

COSTA



- High presence of metamorphic rocks, schist (pizarra in Spanish).
- The rocks are fragile rock sheets, developed within the years by soil's pressure.
- Loamy clay soil (50/60 cm) + schist texture.
- The roots goes up to 2 m of deepness.
- The roots break the stone and absorbed the minerals from the soil.
